Please print the sheets above, download them to use on a phone or tablet drawing App or email us to say you'd prefer hard copies and we'll post these out to you.

As flags are designed to be seen from afar and to be easily identified, so their design needs to be very simple, with meaningful symbols, with only 2-4 colours and have no text.

Using a small rectangle 1.5 w x 1h inch (7.5cm x 5cm) is perfect to plan your design.

These should include your finished design and an explanation of its meaning. You can photograph the sheets and then email these to us, put them on our social media or post them to us.
